<i>Agastache rupestris</i>	Root-beer plant	root beer; licorice-mint
<i>Artemisia Abrotanum</i>	Southernwood	camphor-lemon
<i>Artemisia Absinthium</i>	Wormwood	potently bitter
<i>Artemisia 'Powis Castle'</i>	Silver Wormwood	pleasingly bitter-sage
<i>Comptonia peregrina</i>	Sweetfern	sweetly aromatic
<i>Gaultheria procumbens</i>	Creeping Wintergreen	wintergreen
<i>Helichrysum plicatum</i>	Curry Plant	curry
<i>Hyssopus officinalis</i>	Hyssop	bitter sage
<i>Lavandula</i> spp.	Lavender	lavender
<i>Osteospermum Ecklonis</i>	African Daisy	akin to <i>Calendula</i>
<i>Pelargonium citronellum</i> 'Mabel Grey'	Scented Geranium	intense lemon
<i>Pelargonium tomentosum</i>	Scented Geranium	peppermint
<i>Prostanthera</i> spp.	Mint Bush	Vick's vap-o-rub
<i>Ruta graveolens</i>	Rue	citrus-like
<i>Salvia officinalis</i>	Garden Sage	the sage of cooking
<i>Santolina Chamæcyparissus</i>	Lavender Cotton	pleasantly "herbal"
<i>Satureja Douglasii</i>	Western Yerba-Buena	pennyroyal smell (native here)
<i>Satureja montana</i>	Winter Savory	taste it for a sharp surprise
<i>Teucrium Marum</i>	Catnip (the real thing)	makes cats deliriously joyful
<i>Tagetes Lemmonii</i>	Mexican Bush-Marigold	also called Copper Canyon Daisy
<i>Thymus camphorata</i>	Camphor Thyme	camphor
<i>Thymus citriodora</i>	Lemon Thyme	cv. 'Doone Valley' is superb
<i>Thymus Herba-barona</i>	Caraway Thyme	smells like candy
<i>Thymus pannonicus</i>	Savory-scented Thyme	savory scented
<i>Thymus vulgaris</i>	French Narrowleaf Thyme	the chef's choice

### Deciduous shrubs and small trees:

<i>Aloysia citriodora (triphylla)</i>	Lemon Verbena	lemony
<i>Calycanthus</i> spp.	American Allspice	warm spicy odor
<i>Clerodendrum trichotomum</i>	Harlequin Glory-Bower	peanut-butter odor
<i>Cotinus Coggygria</i>	Smoke Tree	smells like Sweet Gum
<i>Elsholtzia ciliata</i>	Mint Bush	minty
<i>Lindera obtusiloba</i>	Japanese Spicebush	spicy
<i>Emleria (Osmaronia) cerasiformis</i>	Indian Plum; Oso-berry	cucumber scented (native here)
<i>Ptelea trifoliata</i>	Hoptree	citrusy
<i>Ribes bracteosum</i>	Stinking Currant	spicy (native here)
<i>Sassafras albidum</i>	Sassafras	like root beer
<i>Vitex Agnus-Castus</i>	Chaste Tree	sweet and soapy
<i>Zanthoxylum</i> spp.	Prickly-Ash	Szechwan pepper

## Broadleaf evergreen shrubs and trees:

<i>Artemisia tridentata</i>	Sagebrush	the smell of The West
<i>Ceanothus velutinus</i>	Sticky Laurel; Greasewood	cinnamom-balm (native here)
<i>Cedronella canariensis</i>	Canary Island Balm	citronella
<i>Choisya ternata</i>	Mexican Orange	citrusy
<i>Cinnamomum Camphora</i>	Camphor Laurel	camphor smell
<i>Citrus Limon</i> 'Meyer'	Hardy Lemon Tree	lemony
<i>Escallonia illinita</i> = <i>E. viscosa</i>	Curry Escallonia	maple syrup or curry smell
<i>Eucalyptus citriodora</i>	Lemon-scented Eucalypt	lemony; not hardy here
<i>Eucalyptus Nicholii</i>	Peppermint Gum	minty; not hardy here
<i>Eucalyptus Perriniana</i>	Spinning-Gum Eucalypt	Vick's vap-o-rub
<i>Illicium</i> spp.	Anise Tree	anise-like
<i>Laurus nobilis</i>	Bay Laurel	the bay used in cooking
<i>Leptospermum Petersonii</i>	Lemon Tea-tree	lemony; not hardy here
<i>Luma apiculata</i> = <i>Myrtus Luma</i>	Orangebark Myrtle	recalls <i>Myrtus communis</i> smell
<i>Pittosporum eugenioides</i>	Lemonwood; Tarata	lemony
<i>Rhododendron russatum</i>	Rhododendron	rub the buds to get oregano scent
<i>Ribes viburnifolium</i>	Catalina Currant	pine-like; spicy
<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	Rosemary	rosemary
<i>Ugni Molinae</i> = <i>Myrtus Ugni</i>	Chilean Guava	oregano-myrtle
<i>Umbellularia californica</i>	Oregon Myrtle; California Bay	ultra strong bay smell

## Deciduous trees:

<i>Toona (Cedrela) sinensis</i>	Chinese Toon	onion-scented
<i>Tetradium (Euodia) spp.</i>	Euodia	citrus-like
<i>Juglans nigra</i>	Black Walnut-Tree	acrid walnut
<i>Liquidambar Styraciflua</i>	Sweet Gum	resinous
<i>Magnolia salicifolia</i>	Anise Magnolia	anise leaves; lemony twigs
<i>Pistacia chinensis</i>	Chinese Pistachio	smells like Sweet Gum

## Conifers:

<i>Abies lasiocarpa</i> & <i>A. bifolia</i>	Alpine Fir	balsam
<i>Abies grandis</i>	Grand Fir	tangerine; native here
<i>Juniperus occidentalis</i>	Western Juniper	strongest juniper scent
<i>Thuja koraiensis</i>	Korean Arborvitæ	"rich almond-filled fruitcake"
<i>Thuja plicata</i>	Western Red Cedar	recalls pineapple
<i>Torreya californica</i>	California Nutmeg-tree	acrid, sage-like
<i>Torreya nucifera</i>	Japanese Nutmeg-tree	sweet, sage-like
